

Addendum to the Teaching and Examination Regulations Research Master Genomics in Society – Academic Year 2026–2027, transitional arrangement due to temporary discontinuation of first-year curriculum

A transitional arrangement has been established for students of the Research Master *Genomics in Society*, who started their programme before the study year 2026–2027. This is necessary in order to guarantee the continuation of their study programme following the temporary discontinuation of the first-year curriculum in the academic year 2026–2027.

The following arrangements have been made:

- In the academic year 2026–2027, no first-year courses will be offered within the Master *Genomics in Society*.
- For students who have attended first-year courses in 2025–2026, but still need to pass the examinations that belong to those courses, alternative arrangements will be organised in 2026–2027.
- These arrangements will be tailored to the individual student and will be determined on a case-by-case basis.
- The arrangements may consist of alternative examination opportunities or replacement educational activities, provided that the intended learning outcomes of the original course are sufficiently covered.
- The specific arrangements will be established in consultation with the Programme Management, the course coordinator(s) of the relevant course, and the Examination Board.
- The Examination Board may decide that students are required to complete additional or alternative assignments in order to meet the assessment requirements.

This transitional arrangement is intended to ensure that students are enabled to complete outstanding first-year course components in a timely manner, while safeguarding the continuity and quality of the programme.
