Public transportation

RET is the independent public transport company. With the trams or subway of the RET, you can travel to the campus. From Rotterdam Central Station:

Tram 7, direction Woudestein

Stop 'Erasmus Universiteit'.

Tram 21 or 24 direction De Esch

Stop 'Woudestein'.

Metro, direction Slinge

Transfer at Beurs, to subway in the direction of Binnenhof, Nesselande or De Terp. Get off the subway at station Kralingse Zoom. This metro station is within walking distance (10 minutes) of the campus.

Route description car

The Woudestein campus is situated near the A16 and easily accessible by car.

On the A16, from both directions, take exit 25 (Centrum). Follow the signs 'Centrum'. Turn right at the traffic lights (Burgemeester Oudlaan). You will find the Woudestein campus on the right-hand side.

How to walk to the congress dinner venue



When you leave Van der Goot building, turn left. Walk about 50 meters on "Thomas Morelaan" in western direction.

Turn to the left in the direction of "Abram van Rijckevorselweg/S107" for 100 meters.

Turn right to "Abram van Rijckevorselweg/S107" and follow 220 meters. Follow the road to the right to "Honingerdijk" and follow for 200 meters.

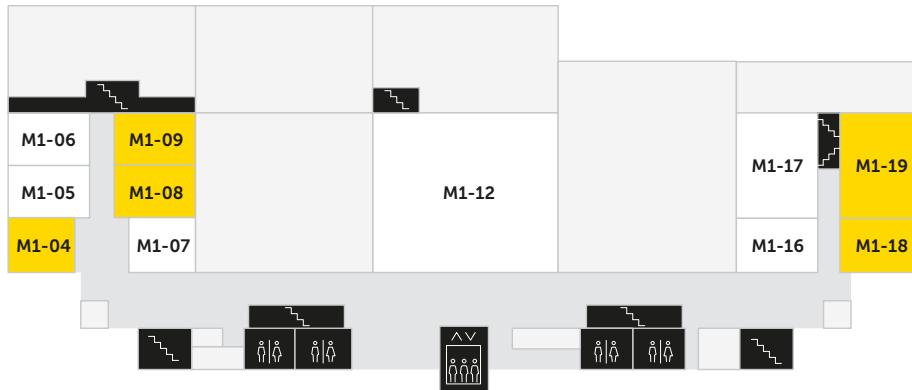
Turn right to remain on "Honingerdijk" and follow for about 90 meters.

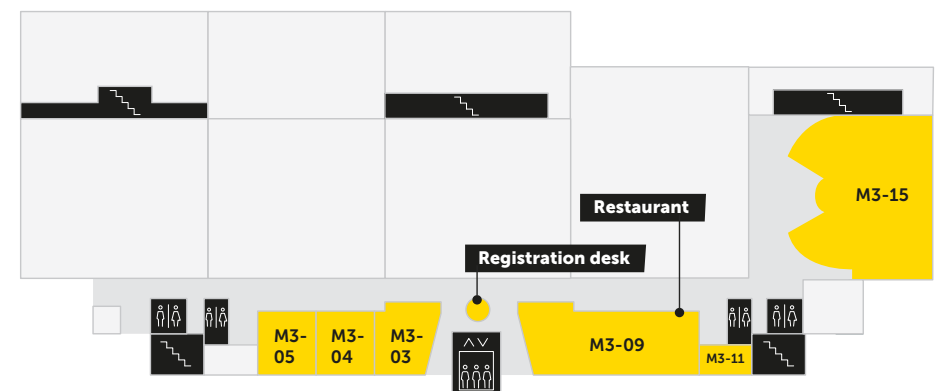
