

Some background information

Who are we looking for?

Erasmus Verbindt is looking for ambitious and socially engaged students who want to develop themselves and make a positive impact during their studies. Of course, we welcome students from all studies and backgrounds. An ideal team member is someone who:

- Has a great interest in taking on societal issues in Rotterdam
- Is interested in findings ways to make science work for the city
- Is somewhat advanced in his/her study (it's not an easy job)
- Is eager to learn and work with students from different disciplines
- Has gained some relevant experience either in or outside the university (this could vary from organizing events and marketing jobs at study associations, to contributing to research initiatives and societal projects)
- Is both flexible and reliable

Some information on the organisation

Together with your colleagues you will function as a 'connector' in our second so called track: 'Erasmus in dialogue with...' which is the backbone of *Erasmus Verbindt*. This track consists of 4 large, interdisciplinary teams who will focus on complex societal issues in Rotterdam. Each team has a different focus, namely:health, sustainability, social inequality or metropolitan challenges.¹ In the lead of each team is a team leader, who is responsible for the overall process and performance of the team. The teams themselves will be supported by the *Erasmus Verbindt* board, who provide them with feedback and networks. They will be assisted by our supporting staff and advised by our societal partners and befriended scientists. Our home base is a brand new 70m2 office in the Schieblock at Hofplein!

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Tasks as a team member

As a team member, you will play an important role in bringing together scientists and societal stakeholders in Rotterdam. Your job is to gain an in-depth understanding of our urban problems. You will look for scientists and city inhabitants alike, who work on these issues from different angles and who would benefit from exchanging knowledge and ideas. You will actively work towards organizing gettogethers/discussions/events with involved attendees on relevant locations in the city. During these events, the focus will lie on gaining a deeper understanding of these societal issues and discussing concrete solutions.

Team members will be:

- Applying and furthering the knowledge of your studies
- Gaining an in depth understanding of societal problems in Rotterdam
- Organizing meetings between scientists and societal stakeholders to discuss concrete solutions
- Develop your own academic, creative and organizational skills
- Learn and work with students, scientists & societal stakeholders from different backgrounds
- Expanding your network and horizon
- Making a meaningful impact
