

Covid-19 and exchange

In general:

- At your own risk and expense
- Keep an eye on the Dutch travel advice (in Dutch) for your country until the day you leave
- Talk to your family, friends, exchange officer to make a well-informed decision
- Have a plan B, like Minor



Up scaled travel advice! Now what?

- 1) Exchange Office at your School will contact you:
- Are you OK and safe?
- Are you in an orange or red area?
- Please respond to the messages you receive (EUR student email inbox) and follow the instructions

You can call the emergency number: +31 - (0)6-408 47 882

- 2) Follow instructions from the Embassy
- Of your own nationality in your host country
- And also of you're not Dutch of the Dutch Embassy in your host country

Regiser at your embassy

- Visit the website of your embassy or state department
- Register
- Receive updates on important safety issues such as natural disasters.
- Be invited to social events and celebrations

Essential preparations

- Did I pass on my contact details and to whom?
- Does my university contact person know where I am?
- Can people reach me in case of emergencies?
- Can I reach people in case of emergencies?
- Do I have proper insurance?
- Did I get/pack my medication, vaccinations and/or prescriptions?
- Where am I going? What are the social and cultural norms? What are the traffic regulations?
- How is my state of mind?
- Am I travelling alone?
- Did I hide my valuables?
- Did I pack my passport/visa and have I mailed copies of important docs to my Hotmail/Gmail/Yahoo account?

Vaccinations & Health Check

Vaccinations

- Also think about neighboring countries you would like to visit
- Also think of prevention of mosquito bites

Medicine use

- Bring your own medicines for the duration of your exchange
- Take a prescription/declaration of your doctor with you
- Always check if the medicine is available in the host country (or alternatives)
- Inform your surroundings of your medical condition
- Carry information on you about the medication

Take a	travel & cancellation insurance which covers:	
	All medical costs without limits)	
	Costs caused by disability that result from an accident	
	Repatriation (in case of illness, death, family circumstances)	
	Legal assistance	
	Third-party liability	
	Luggage	
Also:		
	Check if you need to report to your current helath insurance company that you are going abroad	
	Make sure you know how to claime your expenses. Have it available offline at all times	
	Bring proof of your insurance with you	
	Read the small print	
	There are specialised insurance packages for students, like <u>AON</u>	

Mental health & Culture shock


Mental Health

- 2. Prepare for cultural differences
- 3. Learn from exchange alumni and locals
- 4. Recorgnize culture shock

Emergencies

- Emergency services
- Health services
- Emergency exits (room/campus)
- Plan B if you room/apartment is unavailable
- Embassy / Consulate (add phone number to your contact list)
- Weekly phone call with parents or friends
- To avoid: protests, demonstrations, miliary complexes (be aware, do you own assessment)
 & at all time, keep a low profile!
- Who will take care of you in case of a quarantine situation?





Country specific information

Check for:

- Risks of tsunami/earthquakes/forest fires etc
- Protests
- Strict laws
- Rules on Drugs
- Traffic rules / drive on the left
- Holy places
- Clothing
- Climate
- Food
- Language
- Cultural awareness
