Insurance

When living in the Netherlands, you are legally required to have sufficient health insurance. We strongly recommend arranging health, liability and travel insurance before your trip to the Netherlands. It is your responsibility to arrange insurance, ideally two weeks before your departure. This way, you are also covered during your journey and right after arrival. There are several insurance providers that offer health insurance for international students.

Public transport

Erasmus University collaborates with Student Mobility to provide international students easy access to all forms of transport in the Netherlands. With Student Mobility you are able to receive a customized public transport card (+ an ISIC Student-ID) with special discounts for international students! You can use this card for train, tram, metro and bus.

First registration in NL

If you're moving to the Netherlands, you are usually required to register with the municipality where you'll be living. This process is known as "first registration". Depending on the length of your stay, different rules may apply.

General Practitioner

Since your General Practitioner (GP) will be your first point of contact in case of any health issue you may encounter, we strongly recommend you register with a GP as soon as possible after your arrival in the Netherlands.

Sim card

If you are staying in the Netherlands for a short period, your most feasible option would be to get a prepaid SIM card. You can pick up a free Lebara SIM card at the ESN office on campus Woudestein. Another option is to get an e-sim.

Affordable dining options

meal options to help you manage your daily expenses.
