Munich Summer Institute 2022

June 8-10, 2022 MSI Doctoral Workshop on June 7, 2022

We plan to hold the Munich Summer Institute 2022 as an in-person event (no hybrid meeting) in Munich. If the Covid-19 pandemic makes such physical meeting unfeasible, we will shift to an online event on the same days. This year, the Munich Summer Institute will be preceded by a doctoral workshop on June 7.

Overview

The Summer Institute will focus on three areas:

- Digitalization, Strategy and Organization (chairs: Jörg Claussen and Tobias Kretschmer),
- Innovation and Entrepreneurship (chairs: Dietmar Harhoff, Joachim Henkel and Hanna Hottenrott),
- Law & Economics of Intellectual Property, Innovation & Digitalization (chair: Stefan Bechtold)

The goal of the Munich Summer Institute is to stimulate a rigorous in-depth discussion of a select number of research papers and to strengthen the interdisciplinary international research community in these areas. Researchers in economics, law, management and related fields at all stages of their career (from Ph.D. students to full professors) may attend the Munich Summer Institute as presenters in a plenary or a poster session, as discussants or as attendants. The Munich Summer Institute will feature three keynote lectures, 12 plenary presentations and a daily poster session (including a poster slam). The Munich Summer Institute focuses on quantitative empirical research.

The Munich Summer Institute will be held at the Bavarian Academy of Sciences and Humanities in the heart of Munich. Participation is by invitation only. The organizers will fund hotel expenses for all plenary speakers, poster presenters and invited discussants. It is expected that participants fund their own travel. In cases of financial hardship, feel free to reach out to one of the co-organizers of the Munich Summer Institute.

The Munich Summer Institute only considers papers which have not been published or accepted for publication at the date of submission. Paper selections will be announced in mid-April 2022. The program of the Munich Summer Institute will be available in early May 2022. Final papers will be made available to conference participants on a public website and are due on May 15, 2022. Researchers who would like to attend the Munich Summer Institute without giving a presentation should contact one of the organizers by May 15, 2022.

Call for Participants: MSI Ph.D. Workshop 2022

June 7, 2022

On June 7, the day before the Munich Summer Institute 2022 begins, the MSI organizers will hold a Ph.D. workshop. The workshop is open to all Ph.D. students and post doctorates, though preference will be given to advanced Ph.D. students.

The workshop will cover the MSI's three focus areas:

- Digitalization, Strategy and Organization
- Innovation and Entrepreneurship
- Law & Economics of Intellectual Property, Innovation & Digitization

As the MSI, the MSI Ph.D. workshop will focus on quantitative empirical research.

In the workshop, participants will present their working papers, receive comments from senior scholars, and discuss their papers with the other participants. Participants are expected to have read all presented papers. The number of participants is limited to 12.

Discussants will be senior scholars who participate in the MSI main conference.

We plan to hold the workshop, as the MSI itself, as an in-person event (no hybrid meeting) in Munich, at Ludwig Maximilians University. If the Covid-19 pandemic makes a physical meeting impossible, we will shift to an online event on the same day.
