



For who and when?

The Exchange Programme of Erasmus School of Economics is especially designed for bachelor-3 students. More specifically, the best time for students to go on exchange is during the fall semester of the third year. This way, in most cases, you will have the possibility to participate without any study delay. In contrast, when going on exchange during the spring semester (block 3 and 4), you are likely to experience study delay. You should contact a study adviser to discuss the possibilities in this case.

For master students the options to go on exchange are limited and will cause study delay as courses completed at a partner university cannot be incorporated in the master programme.

Financial matters

All students who go on exchange stay enrolled at Erasmus School of Economics and pay the regular tuition fee to the EUR. You do not have to pay a tuition fee to the partner university. However, a few partner universities charge administrative fees.

If you are going to study abroad, you might need supplementary funding. While there are many scholarships available, do bear in mind that there are also regulations and deadlines you will need to meet. You can find more information about the possible funding for your exchange on our website:

Application procedure

If you want to apply for the exchange programme, you need to fill in the online application form on our website. If you would like to study abroad during your third bachelor year, we advise you to start planning during block 2 of bachelor-2. Bear in mind that a limited number of places is available and all students will be selected, based on study results and a motivation.

Check the deadlines, as you definitely do not want to miss them!
