

Respectful language: e.g. talking about obesity






Participatory Action Research



PAR is about

- respecting and understanding the people with and for whom researchers work
- realization that local people are knowledgeable
- enabling people to set their own agendas
- giving them ownership over the process



(Cornwall & Jewkes 1995:1674)

PAR is about

- should be concerned with the lived lives of people; with issues that are important to them.
- needs to be understood as a means to a political end in order to make things better
- needs to be inclusive The key is to create opportunities for people to participate on their own terms, and not simply to satisfy the expectations of the adult community.



Argumenten voor participatie

- uniek perspectief
