#### About the book numbers:

The book number is made up of the abbreviation RLK, the rubric number (four figures), followed by the first four letters of the author's name. E.g. RLK 20.07 FREE (= Cynthia Freeland, But is it art? Oxford 2001).

Some rubrics within art, history and travel are arranged by continent and therein by country. The final element is always the author's name in its first four letters. E.g. RLK 15.70 eu-ital BOUC (= Patrick Boucheron, The power of images, Cambridge 2018).

Biographies have the number RLK 16.00 followed by the first four letters of the subject's name, and lastly the first four letters of the author's name. E.g. RLK 16.00 bowi LEIG (Wendy Leigh, Bowie: the biography, New York 2014). Books about artists have a similar book number, with the first four letters of the subject's name and the first four letters of the author's name following the rubric.

The open collection houses just a small part of the Leeskabinet collection. For the ca 250.000 books in the depository, see the online <u>catalogue</u> or ask at the desk!
