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## Chains in our programme

- Clear sequential structure in programme.
- Chain: set of related courses.
- Smooth flow within chain and between chains.
- Regular (=yearly) meetings to discuss each chain.
- Input from lecturers, client chains, education committee and management.
- Schedule of chain

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#### **Accreditation**

- Needed for government financing
- Self study
  - Managed by education board
  - Input from bachelor coordinator and education committee.
- Site visit by committee
  - Early 2016
  - Education board, bachelor coordinators, education committees, faculty, students
- Accreditation committee likes to see evidence

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## Critical issue: quality of exams

- No systematic evaluation
- Project team examines this issue further

What should we do:

- First start: peer review
  - Let a colleague evaluate your exam
  - Indicate which colleague has done this when you hand in at the secretariat.

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## **Critical issue: theses**

- Theses with "Lenient 6" (InHolland)
- Exam committee: sample of 50 Theses
  - Pass is indeed pass (no lenient 6s)
  - Variation in grades

What should we do

- Variation in combination of supervisor-coreaders
- Coreaders should read before signing
- Motivate grade by the assessment form

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#### Critical issue: skills

- Econometric skills: many assignments
- Study skills: study guidance
- Academic skills: more attention needed
  - Writing
  - Presenting
  - Cooperation in teams
  - Reporting
  - Research
- Check where we can integrate this.

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# **Teaching backup**

- Short blocks: susceptible to shocks
- Idea: backup person for incidents
- He/she knows big picture of the course
  - Access to teaching material / blackboard
  - Not meant to take over the course
  - Ideas?
