



Intellectual Property (WP)

Target Group

All academics who now or in the future not only wish to publish findings or other products of their creative work, but who also want to allow their work to be used within society. This course offers a broad overview of the field of intellectual property and provides an introduction to the areas of law with which an academic may come into contact in the course of his or her work.

Goal & Results

It is crucial to protect your ideas in the form of a patent, copyright or trademark rights when you wish to publish your findings or other products of your creative work or if you want to allow your work to be used in society.

Course Content

The course addresses the nature and function of intellectual property rights in general, and within the University in particular. Patents and copyright will be dealt with in detail.

Working method

In this course we will alternate theory with practical examples so that the information is presented in a recognisable context. This working method means that the course will take the form of an interactive workshop rather than a lecture on theoretical principles.
