EU Health Law Course 11 May – 2 June 2015 Rotterdam, Erasmus University Rotterdam

A new course on EU Health Law started early May at Erasmus University Rotterdam. The course welcomed 49 registered participants from various countries (Netherlands, Luxembourg, Spain, Italy, Finland, Czech Republic, Poland, Ireland, UK and Ukraine). This course is open for university students interested in health law and the EU. Open access video lectures and seminars enabled foreign students to participate directly with discussions. Course materials were distributed to all participants in advance, which enabled students to prepare the daily sessions.

The assessment included writing a paper (in English) addressing an EU health law-related topic. All course participants received a Certificate of Attendance.

Part of the course were several field visits (European Parliament, Health insurance company and Public Health Authorities).

Next year's course will start in the next academic year (2015-2016).
