The EU Health Law Course (11 May – 2 June 2015 Rotterdam, Erasmus University Rotterdam) was a great success, more than 26 participants from 9 EU and non-EU countries participated this new elective. Participants had access to open access video lectures and seminars. This enabled foreign students to participate directly with discussions. Course materials were distributed to all participants in advance, which enabled students to prepare the daily sessions. All course participants received a Certificate of Attendance. The course included several field visits (European Parliament, a regional Health insurance company and the Public Health Authority).
