

- Personal and academic development
- Once in a lifetime opportunity
- Necessity!



Who can go on exchange?

- Bachelor 3 students
 - IBEB
 - Econometrics and Operational Research
 - Economie en Bedrijfseconomie
 - Econometrie en Operationele Research
 - Fiscale Economie
- Master students
 - Limited availability of destinations
 - No mobility window

When can you go on exchange?

- Fall Semester (Block 1 and 2)
 - No study delay for most BSc students
- Spring Semester (Block 3 and 4)
 - Study delay



Requirements

- Fulltime student at ESE
- Completed Ba-1 and obtained min.
 Fall Semester
 20 ECTS of Ba-2 at ESE (80 ECTS in total)
- Completed Ba-1 and obtained min.
 Spring Semester 40 ECTS of Ba-2 at ESE (100 ECTS in total)
- Average grade: min. 7.0 (for non-EU destinations)
- Language and GPA requirements of partner university (if applicable)
- Obtain at least 24 credits during exchange



- Reputation of the host university (QS Ranking!)
- Competition for exchange places and eligibility
- Courses
- Culture
- Cost of living


Application procedure

- Online Application form
 - Three destinations (all are considered equal)
 - Academic transcript in English (print-out Osiris of all grades)
 - Full colour passport scan
 - Motivation letter

- Deadlines
 - Fall Semester 2016/2017: 15 January 2017
 - Spring Semester 2016/2017: 15 September 2017

Selection procedure

- Meet requirements
- Allocation based on student choices
- · We try to reach an optimal distribution
- Applications > places:
 - Average grade
 - Motivation letter
- If necessary: a second placement round
- Final decision via e-mail in February

After Selection

- Pre-departure meeting for selected students in February
 - Selection letter
 - Terms and Conditions
- Nomination to partner university
- Students apply to partner university
 - Mind requirements and deadlines!

Which courses can you take?

- Students need to obtain a minimum of 24 ECTS
 - 12 ETCS: courses within the economical domain (also business/management and mathematical courses)
 - 12 ECTS: free to choose from the academic course offer
- Exceptions: Master Students, Double-degree, fourth year students → minimum 16 ECTS

- Student report

Free mover


- If there is no agreement on exchange between Erasmus
 School of Economics and the university you wish to go to,
 you may go on exchange as a 'Free Mover'
- You have to arrange everything yourself
- No exemption from tuition fees
- No guarantee that courses can be incorporated




